**Scoring Details**

- The reported score is a scaled score between 120 and 180 points.

- You gain points for correct answers.
- You do not lose points for incorrect answers.
- Every question is weighted equally.
- The three (3) multiple choice sections (not including the “experimental section”) are given a *raw score* based on how many questions you answer correctly.
  - The *raw score* is then converted to a *scaled score* between 120 and 180 points.

**Writing Sample:** The writing sample does not receive a score, but it is submitted to all law schools along with the LSAT score as a part of the student’s application.

**Calculator Policy:** Calculators are not allowed on the LSAT.

**Experimental Section:**

- The experimental section could appear as an additional logical reasoning, analytical reasoning, or reading comprehension section.
- Since the experimental section will look like a different section, you will not know what section it is.
- **This section is not counted toward the student’s score**, however you should try your hardest on every section, because you may not know which one will not count towards your score.

**FAQs...**

- **How often can one take the test?**
  - Typically 8 times per year, sometimes 2 days in a row are offered
  - Maximum of 5 times in a 5 year period, 7 times in a lifetime
- **How long does it take to get the scores back?** Approximately 3 weeks
- **For how long are scores valid?** Scores never expire
- **Is there a reference sheet?** No
